



Last year, Giving Day donors took UF Astronomy to new heights. Funds raised in 2023 helped launch new programs that are enhancing the student experience and fostering undergraduate research, such as PULSAR (Promoting Undergraduate Learning and Studies in Astrophysics Research), an astronomy club founded by student Grady Robbins (pictured above, second from left) and Astronomy Department Chair Elizabeth Lada. Giving Day funds enabled the department to sponsor PULSAR activities like an ice cream social where students connected with professors and scientists to learn about research opportunities, a symposium for students to hone their presentation skills and an internship panel discussion.






Undergraduates, Bella Macias and Dana Yaptangco (also pictured above) founded a new mentoring program called WAAM! (Women in Astronomy and Astrophysics Mentoring) using funds from 2023 Giving Day. As part of this program, established juniors and senior ASTRO majors mentor incoming students in their 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> year. WAAM! is open to all students to be mentors or mentees and particularly encourages women participation. Funds were used to support activities such as getting to know you events and professional mentor training sessions.
